 $\bigstar$  First Stop: Ebenezer Baptist Church  $\bigstar$ 

- 1) One of the wealthiest African-American neighborhoods in the US was **Sweet** Auburn.
- 2) The Martin Luther King, Jr. National Historic Site and Preservation District is part of the National **Park** Service.
- 3) Mrs. Coretta Scott King and President Jimmy Carter made this a national historical site on October 10, 1980.
- The buildings and landscape were restored back to how it looked in the 1960s so tourists could see how the area looked when Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was alive.
- 5) Both Dr. King's **father** and **grandfather** preached at the church. He later preached there as well.
- 6) The church's history goes back **134** years.
- 7) There were only **5** pastors of the church.





- 8) The church was founded in 1886.
- 9) Dr. King, Sr. pastored at the church from 1931 to 1975.
- 10) **Mrs. King** requested for Dr. King's **sermon**, "The Drum Major Instinct", to be played during his funeral service.

- 1) Dr. King was born in the house in 1929 and moved out in 1941.
- 2) Dr. King's grandfather bought the house in 1909 and paid \$3500.
- 3) In the family picture, Dr. King is sitting next to his **brother** and **sister**.
- 4) Dr. King skipped 2 grades and attended college at the age of 15.
- 5) In the family parlor, Dr. King and his brother had to take piano lessons.
- 6) The King family believed that every member of the **family** should be around the dining room table once **dinner** was being served.
- 7) Dr. King's favorite place was the kitchen.
- 8) When Dr. King's sister was young, she got her **arm** caught in the washing machine.
- 9) Christine's room is one of the most original rooms in the house.
- 10) One of Dr. King's **chores** was to shovel coal in the furnace.





- 11) Dr. King also lived in the house with his grandparents, aunt, and uncle.
- 12) In the birth room, the clock is set to **12** o'clock because that is the time Dr. King was born in the room.
- 13) When Dr. King was born, his first name was actually Michael and not Martin.
- 14) Dr. King and his brother loved to play **baseball**.
- 15) The houses across the street were called **shotgun** homes because you could look through the front door and see directly out of the back door.
- 16) Dr. King spoke about the "**beloved** community" because his house sat right in between the rich and the poor.
