



## Birmingham Campaign Video Guided Practice (Source)

**Instructions:** Watch the video and complete the video guided practice.

- 1) The wives of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., Rev. Ralph Abernathy, and Andrew Young knew each other prior to them meeting.
- 2) Their wives experienced the **worst** of segregated life and the best of economic opportunity.
- 3) A Quaker family arranged for the wives to go to school at Antioch and Manchester.
- 4) Andrew Young and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. met at Talladega College in 1957.
- 5) The United Church of Christ hired Andrew Young and sent him to work with Dr. King at SCLC.
- 6) They agreed to fight segregation in Birmingham, Alabama in 1963.
- 7) The demonstrations awakened **America** to the problems of segregation.
- 8) When Dr. King went to jail, there were already 400-500 people in jail.
- 9) The **newspapers** "attacked" Dr. King after he was arrested.
- Dr. King started writing the Letter from the Birmingham Jail on a newspaper while in jail.

**Reflection Question:** What was Dr. King willing to do that was worth living for and dying for?
