- 1) On August 28, 1963, a quarter million Americans, black and white, young and old arrived in **Washington D.C.**
- 2) It was called the March on Washington for **Jobs** and **Freedom**, but it will be remembered as the turning point in the fight for civil rights.
- 3) Among the **speakers** was the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.
- 4) He gave his “I Have a **Dream**” speech.
- 5) Months earlier, images of **fire hoses** spraying on the backs of school children flooded the television screens.
- 6) President **Kennedy** had seen enough.
- 7) In June of 1963, President Kennedy presented Civil Rights **legislation** to Congress.
- 8) The March on Washington was the largest **demonstration** in the country’s history at that time.



9) They walked from the Washington **Monument** to the steps of the **Lincoln** Memorial.

10) There were diverse performances, but Dr. King was the **last** to take the stage.

11) During his speech, he put aside what he prepared and shared with the crowd his **dream** of equal rights for all.

12) Less than one year after the March on Washington, the **Civil Rights Act** of 1964 was signed into law.
