The Birmingham Campaign - Station Learning

Directions

After the teacher splits students into four cohorts, students will rotate around the classroom to learn more about the Birmingham Campaign. Each station will last 10 minutes. As you complete each station, complete the graphic organizer below.

<p>Station One, Online Instruction: Using personal devices, students will read about the Memphis Sanitation Workers' Strike from the Martin Luther King, Jr. Research and Education Institute.</p>	<p>Station Two, Text Comprehension: Students will receive a text of Dr. King's "I've Been to the Mountaintop" speech, delivered April 3, 1968. They will watch a video clip of the speech while reading along with the text.</p>
<p>Station Three, Teacher-led Discussion: Using images from the Lorraine Motel and Bessie Brewer Boarding House, the teacher and students should discuss the assassination of Martin Luther King. The teacher will also play "Abraham, Martin and John" by Dion.</p>	<p>Station Four: Collaborative Activity: Students will work together to read about the history of the "I Am A Man" sculpture in Memphis, TN.</p>
